## Restore: Housing Project Worker

Restore is expanding and requires an additional Housing Project Worker.

Do you have the experience and expertise to make a difference to the lives of people who have been homeless? Do you have the determination and resolve to sustain you through challenging and demanding situations? If you do we have a vacancy that meets your profile.

We provide homes for men and women who have been or are at risk of being homeless. Critically we also provide support for our tenants through mentoring, advisory and personal development opportunities. Without support many of our tenants would return to lifestyles that put them at risk of being homeless again. This support is provided by our Housing Project Workers. The process of moving from supported living into an unsupported tenancy and employment can be a slow process and requires great patience.

We are expanding to provide homes for 31 people who need support to maintain their tenancies. They are referred to us by a range of agencies. Homes are provided without prejudice or favour to those who will benefit from the support we offer. Restore was formed in 2010 by Christians with a shared vision to help homeless people and remains dependent on the prayers and generosity of the Christian community to fulfill and maintain its vision. The successful candidate will need to feel comfortable with the ethos and aims of Restore.
